Progress at the Club Station, Report #1

Work is going forth this month on upgrades to our YARC club station in the Jeep Posse Building. K7PVY, KG6AY, K8FB, and N6KZ installed the antenna control switches for two HF positions (160-10M), a 6M position, and a 2M / 70cm FM position. This arrangement will allow simultaneous operation from all four positions on 160M through 70cm.

K8FB installed computer system upgrades to make operating data modes easier, using a wireless keyboard/mouse. KJ6KMK passed on a nice ARRL world map that is now framed and installed at the station. We are still looking for a donation of a 4- or 5-element 6M Yagi antenna to install on our tower to complete our station antenna design. Is there a YARC member who is reading this newsletter have an old 6M Yagi antenna (that is not being used) who is willing to donate it to the club?

Progress at the Club Station, Report #2

As I reported last month, Randy Dashiell W6TYV and friend Curt Freeman KI7OWL built counter-tops and shelves for the YARC club station. Recently Art Protas KG6AY, Jim Zimmerman N6KZ, Mike Reid N7IEP, Tim Norton K7PVY, and Frank Bender K8FB have been re-assembling the station at the Jeep Posse building. Art and Jim have been doing the bulk of the extensive work required to get the station set up.

The station consists of three operating positions. The main station position is Kenwood TS-570D, using antennas for 160 through 10M on all bands except 60M. This station is set up to work SSB, CW, FM (on 10M), and most digital modes, including the new FT8 digital mode.

The second position is an ICOM IC-718, operating SSB, also using antennas from 160 through 10M on all bands except 60M.

The third position is an ICOM IC-706 Mk II, which will primarily be used on 6M. This station currently does not have a 6M antenna. If someone has a 6M Yagi antenna that is not being used and would like to donate it to YARC, please contact Art and Jim at ask.elmer@w7yrc.org.

We also have a dual-band VHF/UHF FM rig, with a TinyTrac4 TNC that can be used with RMS Express WinLink.

Club station antennas include a dual band VHF/UHF Comet X-50, an HF tri-band Yagi (10, 15, and 20M) with a 40M dipole extension, a WARC (30, 17, and 12M) rotatable dipole, and a 160 / 80M dipole. The antennas are now supported by our 55-foot crank-up tower.

YARC has a truly awesome club station. It is really something to be proud of. Stand by for operating activities that will be scheduled at the club station in the near future.

August 2017 Foxhunt

The monthly foxhunt was held Saturday, August 12, 2017. Bob WB6ODR and Robert WA6FBA were the foxes. There were five teams for this hunt plus one ham who was just checking out his equipment.

- * – Time was the same: #2 drove 9.3 miles while #3 drove 14.6 miles.
- ** – The foxes were shutting down and the time was not noted.

The fox picked good a location to hide the transmitters on Katahn Dr. east of Williamson Valley Rd. and a short way south of Pioneer Parkway. Having the foxhunt on a Saturday turned out very well. We had a total of 15 people involved, including the foxes. The team that finished in third place was from California and is considering moving to Arizona — maybe because of our YARC foxhunts!

As you can see by the results, it did not take some teams very long to find the location. I used my SigTrax app on my smartphone to take bearing lines. Theoretically, where they cross is the location of the transmitters. As you can see when you look at the pictures of the hunt (link below), the first two bearings crossed very near the actual location. Unfortunately, we did not have enough faith in the app and we drove out to Granite Lake thinking the transmitters were farther left. Also, had we turned off on one of the side streets off Williamson Valley Rd. as we drove south from Pioneer Parkway to Iron Springs Rd., we likely would have found the transmitters in a competitive time. Overall, it was a great hunt, good hiding location and very good participation.
